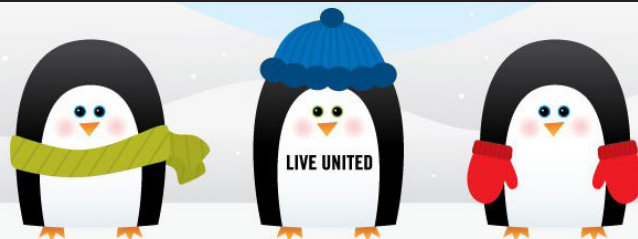
Holiday Drivers Needed
